# Why?

- \* Deut 11:18-24 We must teach our children the ways of God and of his people, and his people have sex, or they do not have children to teach

# When?

- \* Yesterday! (or much younger than we think)

- \* Primary school age at the latest, middle school is too old... Average age for first exposure to pornography is 11 years.

# The Church and our Children

- \* Sex needs to be a very public topic in the Church
- \* We must create a culture where purity is the expectation and our children know why (and not because they will be punished)
- \* Our children need to understand that there is grace. For many their sexual struggles will be the defining moment for the notions of lostness, sin, grace and forgiveness
- \* A culture where our children see the benefits, they can say: "I see the world, I see the church and I want this for my life"
